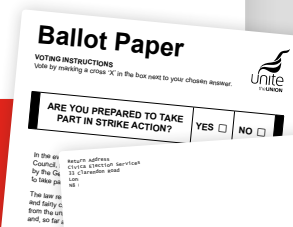

89% of Unite members voting in our consultative ballot voted for the launch of strike ballots over the employer's lousy 3.3% pay offer.

Your ballot paper has one question: are you prepared to take industrial action? **Unite is recommending you vote YES!**

The employers' 3.3% pay offer for 2026 is another insult and another real-terms pay cut.

STAND TOGETHER NOW

— FACT —

Your pay has fallen by more than 25% in real terms on average since 2010. A 3.3% pay rise, which is below RPI inflation, fails to restore the wages you have lost over this time.

— FACT —

You deserve better. The 3.3% pay offer falls well short of our demands and the employers rejected all other elements of our pay claim, while refusing to negotiate. It's simply not good enough.

— FACT —

Council workers are the backbone of our communities. Low pay and the pressure this causes undermines retention and recruitment and damages staff morale.
