STRIKE TOGETHER STRIKE TO WIN

First they tried to take £8,000 a year from WRCOs' wages. Then they did the same to the drivers. Then they bullied and overworked the agency workers they relied on to keep collecting the bins. Now we've all had enough!

Birmingham City Council and Job&Talent have shown complete contempt for their workers. Instead of listening to us and trying to find a solution they have bullied, blocked and blanked us. But now the net is tightening.

Their excuses and lies have been shown as just that. Expert advice reveals that the council:

- Is not exposed to equal pay claims worth millions if it negotiates a settlement
- Is spending vastly more council taxpayers' money to break the strike than it would cost to settle it – £17 million and counting!

The strength and determination of council workers, and now agency workers, means that

management has nowhere left to hide. Announcing the recent ballot results, Unite official Onay Kasab told a packed meeting that the decision was 'historic'.

"Name one other dispute where the agency workers, brought in to break a strike have been balloted and voted to join the strike", he challenged the news reporters.

The vote wasn't just historic it was also hugely powerful – 99% of council workers and 100% of agency workers backed the strike. That is massive! The decision we took was reported on Sky, BBC, ITV, radio stations and newspapers in Birmingham and the West Midlands, around the UK and as far away as China. It was even raised again in the House of Commons.



Now let's see this through and win!
