The struggle to survive

Living in dangerously overcrowded conditions, with poor access to municipal services, residents suffer from frequent water and electricity shortages and sewage backups. Unemployment is high.

The camp is hemmed in on all sides by the 'separation wall' and illegal Israeli settlements, with movement in and out being strictly controlled by the Israeli authorities. Teargas, skunk spray and plastic-coated metal bullets are regularly used against the inhabitants.
