CABLE STREET 90

The Battle of Cable Street on Sunday 4th October 1936 was by far the country's biggest mobilisation against Oswald Mosley's fascists.

Driven by poisonous antisemitism, Mosley planned a provocative march of his Blackshirt thugs through East London's Jewish community.

London Jews and a coalition of the organised working class resisted the fascist incursion, with over 100,000 taking to the streets under the slogan "**They Shall Not Pass!**"

The fascists were unable to march, and the police redirected them – a massive humiliation for Mosley.
